

These five divisions are General & Administrative Division (G&A), Lake Conroe Division, Groundwater Reduction Plan Division (GRP), Woodlands Division, and Highlands Division. SJRA's G&A Division is located at the main building of SJRA's campus on Lake Conroe. This is



where SJRA Board of Director meetings are held monthly. The G&A Division is where SJRA's Senior Management team works, as well as several other departments. These departments include Accounting, Procurement, Administrative Services, Information Technology, Risk Management, Human Resources, and Public Communications. These departments do a lot of the behind-the-scenes functions to keep SJRA running.
