Ever wonder why during a drought, bodies of water such as lakes, reservoirs, or ponds can significantly deplete? The answer isn't just lack of rain, but rather the added evaporation of existing water. So, what exactly is evaporation and how can it lower bodies of water at such a rapid rate? According to the U.S.



Geological Survey, evaporation is the process that changes liquid water to gaseous water (water vapor). This is how water makes its way to the atmosphere from the bodies of water found on the surface of Earth. Heat increases evaporation, that's why the most evaporation happens during the hottest months of the year. Ever notice how if you are boiling a pot of water on the stove and accidentally leave it boiling for too long, the water level dramatically decreases? That's due to evaporation!


