
## Weather Resources

Today, the Highlands Division maintains and operates a pump station on Lake Houston, a canal system running from Lake Houston to a 1,400-acre reservoir in the Highlands area, and additional canals running from the reservoir east and south to two large industrial customers. A number of municipal customers purchase raw(untreated) water from the canal, including Crosby, Newport, and Barrett Station.


