Artificial Fish Habitat Structures



On Saturday, February 1st, members from Major League Fishing, Kubota, TPWD, Local Bass Clubs, Black Bass Stewardship group, and local High School Fishing teams convened at the Lake Conroe Dam Site and worked hard to construct and deploy 31 Mossback artificial fish structures donated to Lake Conroe by Kubota and Major League Fishing. This group of volunteers spent the day constructing and deploying the Mossback Fishing structures which consisted of 14 "conservation cubes" and 17 "reed mats". These structures serve as excellent, long-lasting fish habitat for Lake Conroe Anglers.



Christmas Tree Fish Habitat






