[Bear Branch drainage project secures additional funding in The Woodlands](#)

Additional funding needed for a drainage improvement project at the [Bear Branch dam](#) will be provided by municipal utility districts in The Woodlands, The Woodlands Water Agency told township officials Sept. 18.

WWA General Manager Erich Peterson said local MUDs approved additional engineering funding for the design of the project after the need to expand its scope recently became apparent. The WWA is the central management agency for 10 municipal utility districts in The Woodlands in Montgomery County.

This month we celebrate Lake Conroe! October marks the month that a very wet forecast filled the lake—in less than nine months—back in 1973.

The primary focus of Lake Conroe has always been and will continue to be water supply. This objective was the basis of a partnership agreement the San Jacinto River Authority (SJRA) reached with the City of Houston and the Texas Water Development Board in 1968 to jointly construct a water supply reservoir, Lake Conroe, on the West Fork of the San Jacinto River.

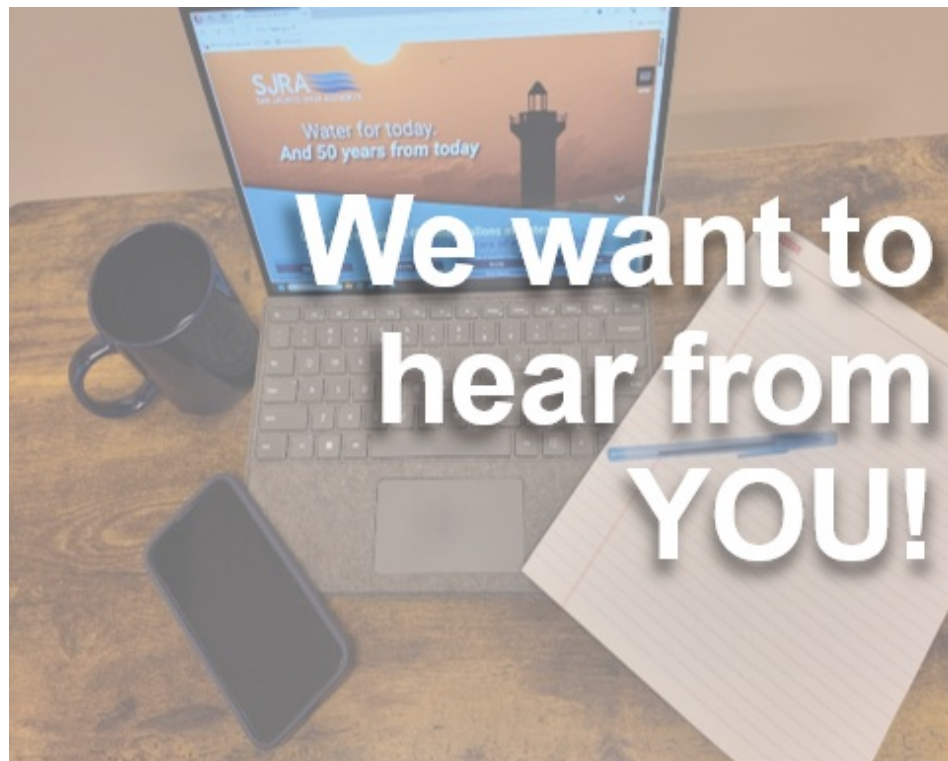

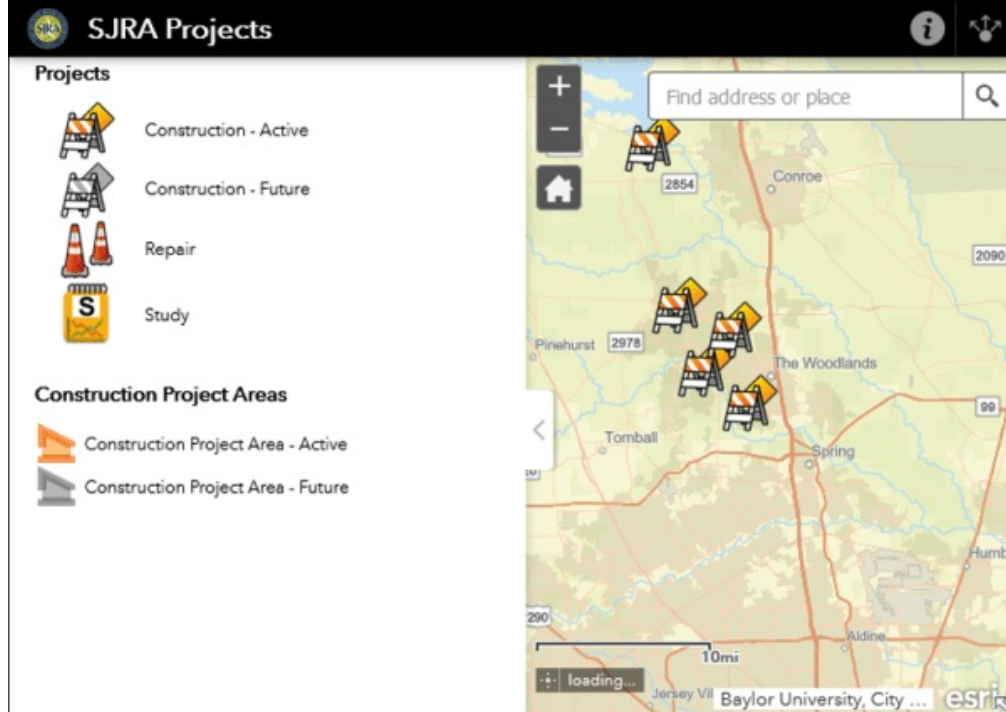
