Operational Status: Winter Storm Fern

Below is a summary of operational performance and service metrics during Winter Storm Fern.

- **Operations:** No service interruptions or system failures
- **Compliance:** No SSOs, permit violations, or regulatory reporting issues
- **Reservoir:** No outflow at Lake Conroe; levels remained below full pool
- **Infrastructure:** No damage to critical assets
- **Staffing:** Critical facilities were staffed and/or monitored 24/7

We extend our sincere thanks to the National Weather Service, local Offices of Emergency Management, County Commissioners, Power Providers, and First Responders for their coordination and leadership during the storm. Their timely

information, preparedness efforts, and dedication helped keep our communities informed and safe throughout the event.


